MESSAGE FROM PASTOR GREG

"We can do hard things!"

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear...John 20.19a

Just after that Easter morning the disciples, not understanding what was happening, went back to a room – perhaps it was the very same upper room where Jesus had washed their feet – and locked themselves in because they were afraid. They didn't know what was going to happen next. In spite of all of the clues that Jesus had given them, and the fact that the Mary had visited the tomb and seen Jesus and reported that back to the disciples, they still cowered in fear. I don't criticize their actions. It's easy to become frozen in fear when we don't know what to do next.

As I mentioned in my April 30 sermon, I am heading on a "grand" adventure. I will run/hike/walk/crawl 50 miles through the Grand Canyon. I readily admit that it's all a bit silly and over the top (or should I say "over the edge"?).

One of the reasons I do things like this is to remind myself that I can do it. Then, when it comes to the really important and difficult things in life, I am reminded that, with God's help, I will be able to do those, too.

There will likely come a moment in the adventure when I think, "It's so hard. I'm so hot. I have nothing left to give. Can I really do this?" And I already know my answer. "Yes, it's hard. And, yes, you can do it."

I will remind of the wisdom I shared in the sermon:

- Take the first step.
- Be smart.
- Rely on one another.
- Simplify the next step.
- Have faith.

We can all do hard things, and those same steps usually apply. Whether it's enduring the pain of a broken friendship, or the frozen grief of losing a loved one that even the warm spring days cannot thaw, or just keeping to our daily and weekly rhythms of faith and practice in this community of faith. We. Can. Do. It.

We know the disciples eventually left that room. In the Gospel of John, Jesus visited them a couple more times, and then – blessed with the Spirit -- they were on their own. And guess what, things got hard! But they kept moving. Thanks be to God, they kept moving.

We remembered Good Friday with a beautiful and spirit-filled re-enactment of the Last Supper. This was a service that had been done by the men in our church 25 years ago. Most of the original actors who are living came back for a repeat performance; we are grateful for all those who helped recreate those last moments with Jesus. 
Viviendo el amor de Dios Viv Lanmou Bondye A Rayuwan Kaunar Allah Living God's Love
