



REPORT FROM OUR 2016 DELEGATES . . .

The Annual Conference mission statement says the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference exists to unite, strengthen and equip the Church of the Brethren to follow Jesus; we believe it has.



Our journey as two new delegates to Annual Conference in Greensboro, NC was an enlightening one. Days began with Bible study and ended in worship and song; a moving experience listening and joining hundreds of voices singing God's word and praises.

The conference theme this year was Carry the Light. A call to follow Jesus out of the darkness and to be a light, a witness to Christ in our actions and good works. The light was shown to us in many ways; by a long distance trucker who drove many miles just to be at the conference, by a professor who shared his experiences in Ethiopia and invited us to join him, by a man who served in BVS in Germany where he met his wife and told of his adventures, by reuniting of BDM, work camp and NYC colleagues.

Business sessions were scheduled for morning and afternoon with three items of old business and five items of new business. (Actual topics and decisions and can found at www.brethren.org/ac2016) Each delegate table seated 7-8 people all with differing thoughts, demographics, districts and occupations. We looked forward each day to take our place at the table and engage in discussion of denomination issues. While debate on some items was spirited, heartfelt and divided we felt the overall tone was one of respect and love.

Departing the conference on Sunday morning we left with feelings of accomplishment and peace. We had dealt with many difficult business issues yet we enjoyed a sense that God had guided our journey, leading us to our own call to carry the light back to our church, our community, our world.

We would like to thank Grossnickle COB for allowing us to serve as delegates at annual conference. To quote a song from the Broadway musical, *Wicked*, "Who can say if I've been changed for the better? I *do believe* I have been changed for the better. But because I knew you I have been changed for good."



'HELPING HANDS'

Elvin Stottlemyer, Youth Leader



This segment focuses on the many groups and individuals in the life of the Church who contribute a great deal to our life together. This space is an opportunity to learn more about these "helpers" and what they do.

Elvin Stottlemyer is concluding his service as "Youth Leader" at Grossnickle Church of the Brethren after some 40 years. This month we celebrate this remarkable "love gift" to Christ and the Church. This interview was conducted Monday, August 15.

Who were some of your first youth?

Tina Spade, Brenda Harne, Dave Delauter, Jay Grossnickle, Danny Harne, Larry Beverlin, Walter Bussard, Donnie Grossnickle, and Dwayne and Gary Leatherman. With only a couple of exceptions, I had their kids in the group as well.

How did you come to be Youth Leader?

I was teaching part-time in an adult class in the sanctuary with Cyrus Grossnickle, Stanley Kline, Harry and Albert Harshman,



and Ralph Kendall in the class, along with others who were teaching at the time. They were all kind of like mentors to me. An opening for the teacher came in the Senior High Youth class and I was asked to fill it full-time.

How has working with youth changed over the years?

In the early years the kids were calling a lot to ask for directions to a school sporting event or asking for a ride to their game. Now everyone has GPS. In the early years the youth went along to deliver gifts to families who needed help at Christmas, or dinners at Thanksgiving. Now there is much more concern for privacy so most of what we give is delivered to a third party like the school counselor and then delivered to the families. That takes some of the joy and inspiration out of the experience, though it is still meaningful. Basically most of what we do now with the youth is what we did then with the youth. A few things have been added along the way. When Patty Hurwitz began helping with the youth we added the "hunger meal." I've attended the kids' sporting events, dance recitals, music concerts, and theater presentations. I've had a lot of help over the years – Dave Doyle, Patty Hurwitz, my sister-in-law Lana, Nelson Buhrman, Cathie Clemson and others. We've gone to King's Dominion, Six Flags, and Hershey Park. An extreme mountain top experience was attending the 2014 National Youth Conference. When the music started that first evening I was overwhelmed in an arena full of youth. All the details were carefully taken care of by the National Youth Cabinet. Weekly preparation for Sunday School has been part of the responsibility also.

What have been your favorite things to do with the Kids?

Shepherd's Spring Retreats, Beach Retreat, shopping for families as a group, Hershey Park, King's Dominion, Six Flags.

What is the best prank that was pulled during your years as Youth Leader?

King's Dominion had a bungee jump one year. Each person had to pay admission to the park and then if you wanted to bungee jump each person had to pay another \$40.00. Everyone got after Elvin to bungee jump. I said, "I'm not paying extra money to do that." By 11:00 that morning money was collected among the group to pay for Elvin to bungee jump. Fortunately, when it was almost my turn the jump shut down for maintenance so I didn't have to jump.

Where have you seen God in these years?

In the eyes of the kids as I have seen their joy and their disappointment. At Camp Blue Diamond some years ago when we would go on retreats there in Southern Pennsylvania and National Youth Conference for certain. Those were some mountain top experiences.

What else should we know?

I've been blessed with a wife who was willing to have me be "on the go" with the kids all these years. Also, being Youth Leader does not happen because the Christian Education Commission names a person youth leader. It happens as one becomes a part of the kids' lives, sharing their sporting events, going to their dance recitals, theater performances, sharing life with them. Also I am grateful that in all the years and all the trips we never had so much as a "fender bender."

Any hopes for the future?

I want whatever happens next to unfold in a way that is best for the kids. I want them to be blessed with leaders who will encourage them into closer relationships with Christ. Nothing would make me happier.

On Sunday, August 21, GCOB held a luncheon in honor of Elvin. There is no way to adequately say, "Thank you," for all these years of dedicated, loving, kind service. But in some small way the Church family attempted to put into words our heartfelt appreciation and love for Elvin. We know you will continue to serve God in other ways in the life of this Church. We pray God's abundant blessings on Elvin and Beverly. Blessings!
